The above-referenced ESR Addendum involves a PEL study for project involving CH 21 and CH 23 (Crete-Monee Road, Pauling-Goodenow Road, respectively) between I-57 and IL-394 from Monee to Goodenow. As this is a preliminary study of the proposed undertaking and investigations are being conducted as how to best improve this corridor, the exact improvements in the project corridor are unknown at this time. Our office tasked the Illinois State Archaeological Survey (ISAS) with completing database reviews of **previously identified** historic architectural resources within or abutting the Environmental Survey Request (ESR) Addendum limits (see attached).

A database historic resources survey of known historic architectural resources was completed for this undertaking, which included reviewing the provided ESR limits for resources that are National Historic Landmarks, listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), previously determined eligible for listing on the NRHP, identified as Will County local landmarks (LL), or surveyed in the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office's Historic & Architectural Resources Geographic Information System (HARGIS) database. This architectural review found 26 known historic resources within the original ESR and addendum project limits (see attached architecture memo), all of which were also identified in the Will County Rural Historic Structure Survey (WCRHSS). The historic resources were assigned identification numbers (HR) to aid in the identification and mapping of these resources. The results of this survey are noted below.

The survey found one historic resource in the project limits that was previously determined eligible for listing on the NRHP:

1. Carl Wilhelm Steiber House (Wayfarer Farm), 109 W. New Monee Rd., Crete -- LL (HR #10)

The proposed project involves a Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study for a proposed freight route in eastern Will County, from I-57 to IL-394. Addendum A adds additional routes to be surveyed. The project is anticipated to include improvements to existing roads, with select greenfield road connections to avoid sensitive resources. This project is being processed as a PEL. As such, in accordance with BDE 11-7.04, a desk top database search for sensitive biological resources is described below. Once the preferred alternative has been determined, a ESR addendum will be submitted for more complete surveys.

Shamplil

The project will involve an unknown quantity of land acquisition. An unknown quantity of tree removal shall occur. Instream work may be required in Deer Creek and/or Rock Creek. The land cover in the vicinity of the project is primally rural, but also contains portions of urban areas in the City of Monee and several large residential neighborhoods.

Review for Illinois Endangered Species Protection and Illinois Natural Areas Preservation – Part 1075

The Illinois Natural Heritage Database contains records of State-listed threatened and endangered species, Illinois Natural Area Inventory sites, and dedicated Illinois Nature Preserves in the vicinity of the project. The Raccoon Grove Natural Area Inventory Site (INAI) and Nature Preserve (NP) occur at the southwest end of the study area immediately south of the intersection of Pauling Road and IL 50. A Class 1-2 (grade A/B or C) prairie site identified during the 2004 IDOT Inventory of Roadside Prairie (Site 38), is also located along IL 50 near the Raccoon Grove NP site. Goodenow Grove INAI and NP occur at the east end of the study area. The NP boundaries abut IL 394 in two locations. The INAI occurs on both sides of IL 394 and within the study area. The Goodenow Grove INAI and NP contain records of state listed Kirtland's snake, Blanding's turtle, and state and federally listed Eastern massasauga rattlesnake. Kirtland's snakes were last seen in 2022 and are verified extant. Records of Blanding's turtles from 2021 are also verified extant. The Eastern massasauga was last seen in 2001, not seen in a 2007 survey, and is considered extirpated. Herpetological surveys will likely be required for any improvements near the Goodenow Grove Nature Preserve / INAI. The Addendum A area intersects with the Monee Railroad Prairie INAI site, NE of Monee along the CN railroad. This

site was also identified during the 2004 IDOT Inventory of Roadside Prairie (Site 37), by INHS as a class 2 (grade C) Dry-Mesic remnant prairie.

Review for Illinois Interagency Wetland Policy Act - Part 1090

There are numerous inventoried wetlands within or adjacent to the ESR limits. There are several inventoried streams crossing the project limits (Rock Creek, Big Walnut Creek, Deer Creek, Plum Creek, Forked Creek). Numerous hydric soils exist within the survey limits. Wetland surveys will be required for future phases of the project.

Review for Endangered Species Act - Section 7

The proposed improvement was reviewed in fulfillment of our obligation under Section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act. Our review included use of the US Fish and Wildlife Service's Information for Planning and Conservation (IPaC) web-based review tool. Through IPaC, an official species list was received and is saved to the project folder. The list contains the endangered, threatened, proposed and candidate species and proposed and designated critical habitat that may be present within or in the vicinity of the proposed improvement. The following species are listed in Will County: Northern long-eared bat (NLEB), Eastern massasauga, sheepnose mussel, Hine's emerald dragonfly (HED), lakeside daisy, leafy prairie clover, and Eastern prairie fringed orchid (EPFO). There is no Critical Habitat in the project vicinity. **Under 50 CFR 402.12(e), the accuracy of the species list is limited to 90 days.**

Northern long-eared bat

Northern long-eared bat suitable summer habitat consists of a wide variety of forested or wooded habitats where they roost, forage, and travel and may also include some adjacent and interspersed non-forested habitats such as emergent wetlands and adjacent edges of agricultural fields, old fields and pastures. This includes forests and woodlots containing potential roosts (i.e., live trees or snags ≥3 inches dbh that have exfoliating bark, cracks, crevices, or hollows) as well as linear features such as fencerows, riparian forests, and other wooded corridors. These wooded areas may be dense or loose aggregates of trees with variable amounts of canopy closure. Individual trees may be considered suitable habitat when they exhibit characteristics of suitable roost trees and are within 1,000 feet of other forested or wooded habitat. Trees found in highly developed urban areas (e.g., street trees, downtown areas) are extremely unlikely to be suitable NLEB habitat.

There will be an unknown quantity of trees removed because of this project. Land use in the project area is primarily rural; however, several forested stream corridors are also present. There are no records of maternity roost trees, maternity colonies or hibernacula in the vicinity of the project corridor. Seasonal tree clearing restrictions (*trees three (3) inches or greater in diameter at breast height will not be cleared April 1 through October 31*) are likely to be included for any project requiring tree removal. Bridge bat assessments (BBA) will also be required for bridges and large culverts that are involved in the proposed project.

Eastern massasauga rattlesnake

Goodenow Grove INAI and NP occur at the east end of the study area. The NP boundaries abut IL 394 in two locations. The INAI occurs on both sides of IL 394 and within the study area. The INAI and NP contain records of state and federally listed Eastern massasauga rattlesnake. The Eastern massasauga was last seen in 2001, not seen in a 2007 survey, and is considered extirpated.

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) Bureau of Design and Environment (BDE) Cultural Resource Unit staff has tasked the Architectural Section of the Illinois State Archaeological Survey (ISAS), with completing a database review to identify known historic resources within the provided Environmental Survey Request (ESR) limits of the Eastern Will County Freight Mobility Corridor Study and PEL. BDE requested a listing of previously identified historic resources within or abutting the ESR limits that were National Historic Landmarks (NHL), listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), determined eligible for listing on the NRHP, local landmarks, or surveyed in the State Historic Preservation Office's HARGIS database. The Will County Historic Preservation Commission's Rural Historic Structure Surveys (RHSS) for Monee Township (2019) and Crete Township (2017) were also consulted for this review.

ISAS thoroughly examined these databases and identified 23 known historic resources in the ESR limits for the project. Some resources have multiple designations or distinctions.

The Carl Wilhelm Steiber House, also known as Wayfarer farm (109 W New Monee Rd, Crete, IL), is a Will County landmark that was listed as Potentially Eligible by the IHPA in 2001. Two additional resources are listed as Will County Landmarks, and 19 are listed as Undermined in the HARGIS database.

The Rural Historic Structure Surveys identified 2 properties as having the potential to be considered for Will County Historic Landmark designation and 18 other resources were listed as *Contributing*. In the context of the survey reports the term contributing is used to denote resources that retain their overall character as historically agricultural sites but lack individual distinction. The survey reports go on to say that none of the sites were judged to be eligible for listing in the National Register and no potential historic districts were identified.






Eastern Will County Freight Mobility Study











As this ESR Addendum is a preliminary study at this time, our office understands that a project addendum will be submitted when a Preferred Alternative is selected. A survey for *unidentified* historic architectural resources will be conducted and the results evaluated when this addendum is submitted.
